## Notes

Except as noted below, data is from the United States Census Bureau, American Community Survey. The figures represent five-year estimates averaging the period from 2017 through 2021.

Taxable retail sales estimates are based on data from Maine Revenue Services. Change in sales compares total taxable sales in a six-month period from June through November 2021 with the equivalent 12-month period ending November 2022. Sales data are collected by "economic summary areas," which do not align exactly with legislative districts. For some districts, data was combined from multiple ESAs.

Unemployment estimates were calculated using ZIP code-level data on unemployment insurance claims from the Maine Department of Labor for December 2022.

Expanded Medicaid enrollment data from Maine Department of Health and Human Services for December 1, 2022.

EITC and CTC data is from the United States Internal Revenue Service, as compiled by the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities for tax year 2019. See [apps.cbpp.org/program\\_participation](https://apps.cbpp.org/program_participation)

Rates of food insecurity in 2020 were estimated using American Community Survey data on district demographics and economic condition, following a methodology used by *Feeding America*.
